In the matter of the unpaid claims against GLENN POOL TOWNSHIP for construction workdone under the supervision of A.C. Bancroft, the recommendation of the County Engineer and the Deputy State Examiner and Inspector presented to this Board be and the same is hereby adopted.

Dear Sir:

I am herewith returning to your letter under date of November 24th. With the papers attached.

It appears from the statement made in your communciation that in June 1923, several construction jobs were performed in Glenn Pool Township, and that your estimate of cost of each of such jobs was less than \$500.00, and that the work was done by Mr. A.C.Bencroft, and that the Township was to pay the cost of the material and labor and allow Mr. Bencroft 15% the reon as compensation for his services, and that warrants were drawn and delivered to Mr. Bancroft for labor and material used in each job plus 15% and that the said Bancroft failed to pay for material and labor, to the amount of \$748.40 and that persons unpaid are now asking the Board of County Commissioners, as the exofficio Trustees of said Township to pay the unpaid claims.

I recommend that the matter be presented to the Board of County Commissioners, and that the said claimants named in your letter be requested to file itemized and sworn claims, and that upon the filing thereof, that the Board of County Commissioners disallow the same.

I am making the recommendation for the reason that I am unable to determine as to the liability of the County under the facts as presented. The construction work as set out in your communication was done under the day labor plan, and the legal question involved is this: "Was it the duty of your Department and the County Commissioners to pay the claimsnts direct, or was it the duty of your Department and the County Commissioners to pay Mr. Bancroft the total amount of the cost of the Construction".

If it was the duty of the Township authorities to pay the claimants direct, then, in all probability the Township is liable for the unpaid claims, otherwise, there would be no liability. I have concluded that this question should be determined by a proper action in Court.
