A contract was entered into with the Klingel Furniture & Undertaking Co.. undertakers and embalmers, of Vinita, Oklahoma, to bury all bodies of paupers from Tulsa County, who are or may hereafter be inmates of the East Oklahoma Hospital for the Insane at Vinita, Oklahoma, in the following manner,

Furnish grave; paupers coffin or casket, lined and trimmed; outside box; underclothes; hose and burial robe, for the consideration of \$5.00 for each

burial.

Said contract to begin and be in force from October 4th 1915 to October 4th 1916. And said undertaking Company agrees that when it shall become necessary to hold a body for the purpose of communicating with relatives or persons interested in same, it will embalm said body, free of charge to Tulsa County.

An order was issued that R. K. Hughes, County Engineer take the measurements across Mingo Creek between Sections 30 and 31 in Township 20, Range 14 East, and report same to the County Clerk for the purpose of advertising for a bridge to be put in across Mingo Creek at that point.

A motion was made by Ed Baker and seconded by A. W. Lucas that the Democrat Printing Company be awarded the contract to print the 1914 delinquent tax list for Tulsa County. Motion carried.

 A motion was made by A.W.Lucas and seconded by Ed Baker, that the tax sale certificate issued to Tulsa County on the Northeast quarter of the Northwest Quarter of section 30% Township 19, Range 13, being Full Blood Indian Minor land, be cancelled, and a division of taxes made according to the present owners as the their interests appear. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ed Baker and seconded by A. W. Lucas that Chas. I. Root Cont.with be appointed Superintendent of Dragging of Roads in Tulsa County, Motion carried. C.I.Root

The Erroneous Assessment of Robt. Fry Guardian, as to Drainage Tax on Northwest quarter of Northeast quarter of section 3, Township 17, Range 13 & Robt Fry, Northwest quarter of Southwest quarter of section 31 Township 18, Range 14 be and Err. As 'mt is allowed, as prayed for in said Erroneous assessment claim filed in the County Clerk(s office.

The Erroneous Assessment of Central Park Addition, was referred to the County Attorney, and he to make report on same and final disposition to be made on Monday, October 18th 1915.

A motion was made by Ed Baker and seconded by A. W. Lucas that Chas I. Root be paid a salary of \$135.00 per month, he being designated as Superintendent of Dragging of all roads in Tulsa, County. And all claims for dragging must have the salary OK of Chas I. Root Superintendent of Dragging before same are payable. Motion carried.

It is ordered by the Board that the Tax sale certificate held by Tulsa County for taxes for the year 1911 against Lots 38 and to 46 inclusive, in Block 34 in Midland Addition to Bixby, be cancelled; said property belonging to two two parties, one of which wished to pay taxes on the property he owned.

A motion was made by Ed Baker and seconded by A. W. Lucas that James Woolley County Sheriff, be instructed to buy two blood-hounds for the Sheriff's help in hunting criminals for crimes committed in Tulsa County. Said dogs not to cost in excess of \$300.00. Motion carried.

The Bond of Bradley & Boydell signed by Southern Surety Company, and the contract to complete the school building at Sand Springs, as advertised, were filed S.S.School and approved, said building to be completed by January 1st., 1916.
