A contract was entered into with the Klingel Furniture & Undertaking Co., undertakers and embalmers, of Vinita, Oklahoma, to bury all bodies of paupers from Tulsa County, who are or may hereafter be inmates of the East Oklahoma Hospital for the insane at Vinita, Oklahoma, in the following manner,

Furnish grave; paupers coffin or casket, lined and trimmed; outside box; underclothes; hose and burial robe, for the consideration of \$5.00 for each burial.

Said contract to begin and be in force from October 4th 1915 to October 4th 1916. And said undertaking Company agrees that when it shall become necessary to hold a body for the purpose of communicating with relatives or persons interested in same, it will embalm said body, free of charge to Tulsa County.

An order was issued that R. K. Hughes, County Engineer take the measurements across Mingo Creek between Sections 30 and 31 in Township 20, Range 14 East, and report same to the County Clerk for the purpose of advertising for a bridge to be put in across Mingo Creek at that point.
