

Upon the instruction of the Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, the following sealed bids for the Surfacing and Improving of Coyote Trail (West Section) From Survey Station 14 / 00 to Survey Station 300 / 00, a distance of 5.416 miles, (Project No. 2-K) were opened: Standard Paving Company's bid in the amount of \$17,017.55, together with their bid check for \$860.00 and Layman and Company's bid in the amount of \$17,477.03, together with their bid check for \$860.00. Upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.

Motion made by Commissioner Gray, seconded by Commissioner Bailey, that a recess be taken until Tuesday, June 24, 1947, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M. Upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.
