

5. REFUNDS. ERRONEOUS ASSESSMENTS. A large number of these applications have been referred to me. I am today reporting on one, and the most important one, i.e., the application of the Producers State Bank of Tulsa for an erroneous assessment on its valuation by reason of having a certain amount of its capital and surplus invested in State Funding Bonds. My opinion has been filed with the County Clerk and will be submitted to you at your meeting today. I expect to report on the remaining applications for erroneous assessment at your first meeting in January, 1922.

6. The audit of the Court Clerk, Freanes H. Harvey, requested by herewill begin immediately after the first of the year and a sufficient force will be used on the audit to complete it as rapidly as possible as the purpose of the audit is to without delay advise the court clerk of the condition of her records and detect and report inefficiency and incompetency among her deputies. Certain emergency suggestions made by us to Mrs. Harvey have already been carried into effect and other suggestions will be placed in operation on the first of the year.

Immediately following the close of the calendar year the Financial Statement, General Fund, and application for supplemental appropriations will be prepared and submitted to you. This work will not consume any great length of time, providing that we find the records of the general fund in proper condition.

WHEREAS, the County of Tulsa by its Board of Commissioners, and in accordance with the laws made and provided therefor, believe it for the best interests of the citizenship of the County of Tulsa, that said county pay for the construction of such part or portion of said Peoria Avenue, between the south line of the corporate limits of the City of Tulsa, and the north line of the corporate limits of the City of Tulsa, as is not contained within and made a part of the corporate City of Tulsa in accordance with the terms and conditions of one certain agreement of even date herewith, entered into by and between the County of Tulsa, by its Board of Commissioners, and the City of Tulsa by its Mayor and Board of Commissioners.
