

A motion was made by F. M. Wooden and seconded by Ira Short that the Depository Bond of the Security National Bank, in the amount of \$25,000.00 made by the Title Guaranty and Trust Company be approved, and that the \$25,000.00 Oklahoma State Public Building bond be returned. Motion carried.

The bonds of the State Bank of Collinsville made by Maryland Casualty Company and the Fidelity and Deposit Company both of Baltimore, Md., each bond in the amount of \$5000.00, and expiring on the 29th day of November, 1922, were filed with and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

The sheriff's Civil reports for deputies and claim for mileage and expense for the month of October, 1921, were filed with and approved by the Board. A like action was taken of the appointments of E. L. Thompson and W. F. Austin, as Deputy Sheriffs.

The official bond of A. C. Hayes as township road supervisor of Boles Township was filed with and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

Pursuant to a petition filed by the Oklahoma Natural Gas Company, for the use of certain highways of the County of Tulsa, the following order was made.

"IN RE: Application of OKLAHOMA NATURAL GAS COMPANY, a Corporation of Tulsa, Oklahoma, to construct pipe lines along and under public highways of Tulsa County, State of Oklahoma, to-wit::

'Beginning at a point 923 feet north of the southeast corner of Section 24, Township 19 north, Range 12 East, Thence North along the public highway known as Peoria Avenue running North and south between sections 24, Township 19 North, Range 12 East and Section 19, Township 19 North, Range 13 East, and between section 13, township 19 north, range 12 east and section 18, Township 19 North, Range 13 East, to the public highway known as twenty first (21st) Street running east and west between Sections 13 and 12, Township 19 Northm Range 12 East; said pipe line to be an eight inch gas pipe line, to be laid eight feet west of west side of paving along said public highway known as Peoria Avenue, and to be known as Service Line - City of Tulsa.'

Now, on this 20th day of December, A. D. 1921, at a regular meeting of The Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, held in compliance with and according to law, the application of the Oklahoma Natural Gas Company, a Corporation of Tulsa Oklahoma, for the right to put down, construct, and operate its eight inch gas pipe line known as Service Line-City of Tulsa, along and under the above specified highway of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, which application is in writing and sets forth that it is necessary for the purpose of further advancing the business of said company in the purchasing, producing, marketing, transporting and conveying of Natural Gas as in said petition stated, to lay, construct operate and maintain said pipe line along and under the specified public highway of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, comes on to be considered and said Board after hearing said application and considering same and being fully advised in the premises finds that said application should be granted/

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED, that the Oklahoma Natural Gas Company of Tulsa, Oklahoma, be and the same is hereby authorized and empowered to lay, put down, construct and maintain and operate this its gas pipe line for the conveyance, transmission, and transportation of natural gas along and under the said specified public highway of Tulsa County, Oklahoma.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, That said gas pipe line be buried so as not to interfere with the ingress and egress of adjacent farmers at the ordinary places of entrance to their lands; and at such other places along said highway where abutting land owners may desire to locate a place for entrance to their lands where so requested by the owners.
