R E S O L U T I O N

DIRECTING THE COUNTY ENGINEER TO PURCHASE THE
STRUCTURAL STEEL FOR A DRAINAGE STRUCTURE IN
SECTION 17-TOWNSHIP 19 N-RANGE 12 E, COMMONLY
CALLED THE BERRYHILL SCHOOL JOB.

WHEREAS, Tulsa County thru and with the assistance of the WPA has caused to be constructed an emergency drainage structure located in Section 17-Township 19 N-Range 12 E, commonly called the Berryhill School Job.

AND WHEREAS Tulsa County has heretofore entered into an agreement with the WPA that Tulsa County was to furnish the structural steel for this drainage structure, date of December 16th, 1937.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that said work has now proceeded to the point where the structural steel is needed and the County Engineer is authorized by this resolution to purchase said structural steel not to exceed the amount of Five Hundred and Twenty Dollars. It is deemed to the best interests of Tulsa County and the citizenship thereof that the said work on the drainage structure proceed to completion so that the same may be used by the traveling public.

Upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried and the drug stores notified.
