

strued as assuming any responsibility on the part of the Board of County Commissioners of said county, or on the part of said county, for any damage arising from the putting down, construction, and operation of said line, but the Oklahoma Natural Gas Company shall be responsible for all damage accruing from the construction of said gas pipe line or which in any wise may be caused or occasioned thereby or by the use of the same.

IT IS FURTHER UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED, that this order and the rights accrued hereunder and granted hereby shall in no wise abridge the right or authority of the County Commissioners, the Township Trustees, and Road Overseers of the Public Highways in said County as the same is now provided by law.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that said line shall be so used, made and constructed as not to interfere with the use of said public highway, nor the repair thereof, nor with the drainage of the highways, and in crossing streams and drains, it shall be placed above or below the same so as not to obstruct the flow of water therein, and when placed under the surface of highways, the surface or roadbed thereof shall be restored to the same degree of safety for travel as the same was before said pipe line was put under the surface thereof.

R E S O L U T I O N.
