Dillinger & Fletcher, making the lowest bid, the following motion was made by A. W. Lucas, and seconded by Ed Baker, "That the contract be awarded to Dillinger & Fletcher, when their bond is filed, and same has been approved, said contract to comply with plans and specifications now on file in the County Clerk's office." Motion carried.

In the matter of the County Fair Board of Directors, it was shown that in three (3) of the Townships of the County, directors for the ensuing term have not been elected, and it became the duty of the County Commissioners to appoint said directors in those townships. A motion was made by A. W. Lucas and seconded by Ed Baker that H. B. Stone and J. C. Shafrer, of Glenpool township be appointed to serve as Free County Fair Directors from Glenpool Township, and Ed Arnall and Clarence White, be appointed to serve two years as directors of Free County Fair Association, in Willow Springs Township, and Arthur Bynum and T. J. Shimp be appointed to serve as Directors of Free County Fair Association from Frye Township. Said directors to serve in such capacity, for a term of two years. Motion carried.
