promotion of Jonie Firestone to that position, effective July 1, 1990, at \$2,664. per month. Upon roll call, Selph, yes; Harris, yes; Rice, yes. Motion carried.

All three Commissioners remarked on the fine job Firestone has been doing and her ability to act as Assistant Director for the department.

Motion by Selph, seconded by Harris, to upgrade the position of Assistant County inspector to grade 80, and to approve, effective May 1, 1990, a new salary of \$2,398. per month for Ron Fields, Assistant County Inspector. Upon roll call, Selph, yes; Harris, yes; Rice, yes. Motion carried.

Leroy Jones and Keith Hamilton, Deputy County Treasurer, were present to request approval of additional computer equipment for the Treasurer's office. A list of the desired equipment totalled approximately \$105,000. Hamilton noted that all equipment being replaced would be available for use elsewhere in the County, and that funds were in place for purchase of the new equipment.

Motion by Harris, seconded by Selph, to approve purchase of the new equipment requested by the Treasurer. Upon roll call, Selph, yes; Harris, yes; Rice, yes. Motion carried. (Clerk's Misc. File No. 132310)

Selph announced the creation of an Adopt-a-Road Program for Tulsa County. This program is coordinated with the State's Adopt-a-Highway Program and has been approved by the District Attorney's office. Participating groups must agree to adopt a two-mile section of road in the unincorporated area of Tulsa County for a period of two years. The agreement requires that the section of road adopted will be cleaned four times a year, with one time being in April. The County will provide litter bags and safety vests for the groups and will also pick up the bags when full for disposal.

Selph also noted that two groups have already committed to sections of road, the Tulsa Wheelmen and the Webster High Key Club with Jane Adams Elementary School.

The Tulsa County Engineer's office will act as coordinator for the program, and will provide the appropriate training for the groups who wish to participate. Each individual agreement for groups to adopt a road will be brought to a formal Board agenda. The program is being publicly announced at a press conference later in the day.

Motion by Selph, seconded by Harris, to approve the Adopt-a-Road Program for Tulsa County. Upon roll call, Selph, yes; Harris, yes; Rice, yes. Motion carried.

Motion by Harris, seconded by Selph, to approve a request from INCOG for refund of zoning application fees to Chester Slavens; Tulsa County's share of the refund will be \$225., and will be deducted from fees collected by INCOG and then sent to the County.
