The following Resolution was introduced by Commissioner Greer, who moved its adoption; said motion being seconded by Commissioner Gray. Chairman ordered the Resolution read.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, there is a surplus of stock, animals, chickens, cattle, hogs, etc., now owned by Tulsa County and located upon the Tulsa County Poor Farm which is more than is necessary for the use and consumption of the inmates of said Poor Farm; that a portion of the aforementioned property might be considered necessary for use and consumption at said Poor Farm later during the year or next year, but owning to the high cost of feed, maintenance, upkeep and care of said described personal property, it is not economical for Tulsa County to longer maintain and keep the same and it is deemed economically wise for said property to be offered and sold at public auction to the highest bidder for each, and

WHEREAS, in addition to the foregoing described property, Tulsa County also has a peanut machine which is no longer necessary for use and same should likewise be offered and sold at public auction to the highest bidder for cash.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT A public auction be held on the 15th day of September, 1943, at the Tulsa County Poor Farm located approximately 9 miles Southeast of Tulsa, Oklahoma, on State Highway 51, commencing at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M., and continusing thereafter until the following described property is sold: That the property to be offered and sold is described as follows:

Approximately 68 cattle
Approximately 100 hogs
Approximately 800 chickens
One peanut mahhine

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the aforesaid property be offered and sold to the highest bidder for cash and that said sale be conducted by an auctioneer; his compensation or commission to be paid by purchaser of said property.
