WHEREAS, Tulsa County owns an 511 Adams Motor Patrol Serial No. 3302 and,

WHEREAS, said Motor Patrol is not serviceable for the uses and purposes of the Highway Department which said Adams Motor Patrol belongs and was purchased and paid for from County Highway Funds, Said Motor Patrol is now considered as junk, and

WHEREAS, the Highway Department is in need of some 36" 14 Gage Galvanized Culvert Pipe and it has been found that the Bert Smith Machinery Company of Enid Oklahoma has such pipe and will make a trade or exchange for Sixty Four (64) feet of said 36" Galvanized Culvert Pipe, valued at Five Hundred Eleven Dollars and Thirty Six Cents (\$511.36).
