WHEREAS, plans having been presented to this Board for examination on this 6th day of March, 1922, for a bridge proposed to be constructed over Bird Creek where the same crosses the line between section 4 and 9, township 20 north, Range 14 East, such plans having been prepared by the County Engineer, the approximate estimate of cost being \$38,675.00

AND, WHEREAS, plans having been presented by the County Engineer for a proposed bridge to be located between Sections 26 and 27, township 19 north, Range 12 East, the approximate estimate of cost being \$2,517.00.

NOW, THEREFORE ~~BE~~ IT RESOLVED THAT this Board approve said plans and that the County Engineer be instructed to advertise for bids to be opened and considered by this Board on the 20th day of March, 1922, between the hours of 2 and 3 o'clock P.M. of said day. That the Bird Creek Bridge if contract be awarded be paid from the Road and Bridge Fund; that the proposed bridge between Section 26 and 27, Township 19 north, Range 12 east be paid from Red Fork Township Funds.

In the matter of the application of J. K. Livingston for relief from an erroneous assessment it is ordered that a hearing thereon be fixed for March 28th, 1922, at the hour of ten o'clock A. M. The applications of the Mid Continent Brick & Tulsa Company and H. Appleman estate to have hearing same date.

A motion was made by Ira Short and seconded by F. M. Wooden that the Claim of J. S. Greer for \$150.00, for the death of a horse on the Arkansas River Bridge be and the same is hereby disallowed. Carried.
