

Your attention is called to the fact that on September 1st. 1925, Dolly Boatright was paid the sum of \$733.19, on County Clerk's Voucher No. 5744. This payment was made under a contract then in existence between Miss Boatright and the Board of County Commissioners as delinquent tax collector, and the amount represented commissions accrued on collections presumed to have been made upon delinquent tax warrants.

Your attention is further called that during the months of September, October 1925, and August, November and December, 1926, the County Treasurer apportioned to the credit of Miss Boatright, the sum of \$4,797.41 as alleged commissions due to her under the above mentioned contract.

In this connection you are advised that the Supreme Court of the State of Oklahoma in an action wherein Miss Boatright instituted a mandamus proceeding against your County Treasurer to compel him to apportion and pay a part of the unpaid amount to her under the terms of said Contract. This case was tried in the District Court of Tulsa County and appealed from a judgment rendered thereon to the Supreme Court, and the judgment of the Supreme Court was against Miss Boatright holding for various reasons that the contract was invalid and she was not entitled to recover or be paid any sums thereunder.

Inasmuch as the sum of \$733.19 paid to Miss Boatright was illegally paid, it is your duty to direct the County Attorney to bring a proper action against Miss Boatright and the Sureties on her Bond to recover said amount.
