This item of \$1260.05 has practically been taken care of as \$887.10 of it has been transferred from the General Fund, current, to the General Fund, old, and a refund has been made to the General Fund for the balance of \$372.95.

Out of the surplus reflected in our Financial Statement, to-wit: \$32,287.79; \$20,062.61 must be appropriated to take care of overdrafts, leaving a balance for additional appropriations of \$12,225.18. In the event that this amount is not sufficient to take care of additional needs for the remainder of the current year, it will be necessary to transfer such portions of the unexpended balances of the several appropriations in the different departments by cancellation, and in order to do this it will be necessary for Mr. Lawson, County Clerk, to confer with the heads of the several departments and ascertain what amounts of their unexpended balances of their appropriations may be safely transferred.
