

This day came the Democrat Publishing Co. By Wm Stryker its President and Bidison and Campbell said Company's attorneys and moved the Commissioners to reconsider and disregard and annul the action taken by them on Feb 7-1911 in awarding the public printing to the Tulsa Publishing Co - The ground of the motion being that the Tulsa Post and Owasso Dispatch is not a legal paper.

Also came the Tulsa Publishing Co. By Mrs. McParty and by Wrightsman Reed and Bush and by Davidson and Williams its attorneys and objected to the aforesaid motion.

Said objection was overruled to which the Tulsa Pub Co excepted. The said motion of the Democrat Pub Co. was then heard upon oral proof and argument of counsel for each side. Upon consideration of said motion, it is now ordered that the said motion of the Democrat Pub Co. to reconsider and disregard and annul was overruled.

The Commissioners being of the opinion that the Tulsa Post and Owasso Dispatch is a legal paper for public a required by law and the action taken on Feb 7-1911 in awarding the printing to the Tulsa Pub Co. hereby stands and the said Tulsa Pub Co. is the legal paper for County printing paid for by the County Commissioners.

The foregoing was adopted by the Commissioners after hearing the testimony of Wm Stryker, B.F. Shepherd and Mr Hutchinson under oath.

The County Clerk was authorized to advertise for bids for water works system for new Court House according to specifications on file in his office Commissioners reserving the right to reject any and all bids.
