

ranges numbered 12th & 13, East. Thence running South - a distance of 3 miles - along said highway. Thence running East a distance of 1 mile along the public highway. Thence along the public highway a distance of 2 miles. Thence East a distance of $\frac{3}{4}$ of a mile along the public highway in all a distance of $(6\frac{3}{4})$ Sixth & three quarters miles.

The poles and wires of said telephone line to be located so as not to interfere with the full use and enjoyment of the highway by the public and so as not to interfere with working and repairing said highway, and also that all wires and poles be located so as not to interfere with the rights of property owners along the portion of the public highway traversed by said telephone line, leaving unobstructed by wires or poles all ways of ingress and egress.
