## MINUTES THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 8, 1988

The Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, met at the hour of 9:00 a.m. with the following members present: Lewis Harris, Chairman; John Selph, Member; Melvin C. Rice, Member. Members absent: None. Others present: Ray Jordan; Linda Knowles; Jim Crawley; Ray Hasselman; Clay Edwards; Marshall Stuart; Vera Carroll.

Lewis Harris, Chairman, presiding, called the meeting to order at 9:04 a.m., and the following business was transacted:

As directed by the Board, Jordan presented minimum estimates for the improvements to the Highway Department facilities. The estimated cost of these facility improvements is \$876,500.00. It was the consensus of the Board that the estimate is still high. The Chairman directed Jordan to work individually with each Commissioner on matters pertaining to their district and report results to the Board on a regular basis.

Jordan requested approval of quotes submitted by Sherwood Construction Co. of OK, Inc., to provide roadway work guaranteed by Tulsa County for the Kimberly-Clark project. Jordan stated the costs quoted were lower than what it would cost the county to do the work, as the Sherwood firm already has their equipment on the site. Motion by Rice, seconded by Selph, to approve quote of
