The following Resolution was introduced by Commissioner Morley, who moved its adoption; said motion being seconded by Commissioner Sallee. Chairman ordered the Resolution read.

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, on the 25th day of September, 1939, the United States Government obtained a judgment in its own behalf, and in behalf of Rosa B. Mills, nee Lloyd, before the United States District Court for the Northern District of Oklahoma, being No. 133 Civil, in said court, for the sum of \$6,634.13, and that the accrued interest on said judgment to this date is now \$132.35, and the court costs \$28.30, and

WHEREAS, it is recommended by the County Attorney's office of this County that said judgment be prepaid out of the Sinking Fund of Tulsa County, and

WHEREAS, it is deemed by the Commission that such action is to the best interests of Tulsa County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that said judgment be purchased and prepaid out of the Sinking Fund of Tulsa County, to be paid \$6,766.48 to the United States Government, and \$28.30 to H. P. Warfield, Clerk of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Oklahoma.
