R E S O L U T I O N

APPROVING THE CALL FOR THE FOURTH NATIONAL ROAD OIL
CONGRESS TO BE HELD IN TULSA, OKLAHOMA, NOVEMBER
16-17, 1934.

WHEREAS, the president of the National Road Oil Congress, the president of the Oklahoma Good Roads Association, and the president of the Tulsa Chamber of Commerce have jointly issued an official call for the Fourth National Road Oil Congress to convene in Tulsa, Oklahoma, November 16th and 17th, 1934, and

WHEREAS, we deem this meeting to be of such far reaching importance to county commissioners, county engineers, and all officials charged with the construction and maintenance of highways that it should be attended and participated in by these officials to the fullest possible extent:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the undersigned county commissioners of Tulsa County, give this movement our most hearty approval and urge county commissioners and county engineers throughout the state to attend this Congress and take advantage of its unusual educational features.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we suggest to W. M. Vlosak of Prague, Oklahoma, president of the County Commissioners Association of Oklahoma, that he issue a formal call for the State Association to convene in Tulsa on these dates to the end that we may have a state-wide conference on the subjects there discussed before the Congress and upon other matters of vital importance to these officials.
