Motion was made by Mr.North, seconded by Mr.Dickey, that T J SMITH be and he is hereby appointed Constable within and for District No.4.Tulsa County. Motion carried.

Motion was made by Mr.North, seconded by Mr.Dickey, that the County Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to turn records of W H HYAM3, former Justice of the Peace, over to U S Bolton, present Justice of the Peace District No. 8, Bixby, Oklahoma. Carried.

Motion was made by W J Dickey, seconded by Mr.Hedgecock, that O s GAGE, be and he is hereby appointed Constable within and for District No. 4, Tulsa County, Okla. Carried.

Motion was made by Mr.North, seconded by Mr.Hedgecock, that the County Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to advertise for building Laundry on the County Farm according to the plans and specifications now on file. Carried. Letting of Bids to be made on the 21st. day of October, 1929.

Motion was made by Mr.Dickey, seconded by Mr.Hedgecock, that the County Engineer be authorized to hire and fire men at the County Garage, with the approval of the County Commissioners. All voting in the affirmative, motion was declared carried.

The following reports were received and ordered filed: Report of Earl E Logan, Clerk, Common Pleas Court for the month of August, 1929, and County Treasurer's report for the month of August, 1929.

County Depository Bond of the First National Bank of mBroken Arrow in the amount of Five Thousand Dollars was examined, found sufficient and approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

The following Resolution was introduced by Mr.North, who moved its adoption said motion being seconded by Mr.Dickey and the Chairman ordered the Resolution read:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Sec. 9988, Chap. 85, C O S provides, that "All section lines in the State are hereby declared public highways. The public highways shall not be less than thirty-three, nor more than sixty five feet in width, according to the dedication, reservation or condemnation thereof, and

WHEREAS, An Act of Congress to ratify and confirm a supplemental agreement with the Creek Tribe of Indians, approved June 30th. 1902, ratified July 26th.1902; effective August 8th. 1902, provides, among other things, "That public highways or roads three (3) rods in width, being one and one half rods on each side of the section line, may be established along all section lines without any compensation being paid therefor; and all allottees, purchasers, and others shall take the title to such lands subject to this provision".

AND, WHEREAS, it becomes nedessary for Tulsa County to establish a highway along a section line in the Creek Nation which has not previously been opened as a public highway,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the East 2706 ft. between Sections 25-36, T 19 N., R 12 E., ie, 51st. Street from Peoria Avenue west to Arkansas River, be opened and declared a County Highway.
