On motion of W. L. North which motion was seconded by Ed Dlaton the con-
tract for the construction of the ten (10) steel bridges in Tulsa County was
awarded to Joseph T. Lantry. The Pioneer Construction Company, Roach and McNulty,
and the Froebe Briscoe Construction company were the other bidders. The certified
checks accompanying these bids were returned to their respective signers.

On motion of W. L. North, seconded by Ed Dalton the following resolution was
passed, and the County Engineer was instructed to locate the roadway as per pet-
ition filed.

RESOLUTION.

WHEREAS, heretofore a petition having been presented, as provided for by law,
to this Board of County Commissioners to establish and locate a road of highway
beginning at a point 100 feet East of the Southerst corner of the West One Half
(W¹/₂) of the Southeast quarter (SE¹/₄) of Section Thirty three (33), Township twenty
(20), Range Thirteen (13) East in Tulsa County, Oklahoma; thense south at a right
angle for a distance of 668 feet to connect with what is known as the County Road
also known as the Ozard Trail.

AND WHEREAS, the said petitioner had given due legal notices for more than
twnty days be advertising in he Official County Paper; also due legal notices
were given to the owners or representatives in the county through whose land the
said^o road goes; and the said cause came on for hearing as in the notices set forth
on he 4th day of August, 1919, in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, and that the same was
continued to the 18th day of August, 1919, when the same came on for hearing upon
the petition filed herein.

AND WHEREAS, the owners of theland traversed, having in fact, donated the land for
for the use of the public road and that the same was used for more then twelve months
previous to this date by the public.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the petition be granted and that the said road
be established and located as asked for by the petitioner; that the said road be of
a uniform width of _____ feet; andthat the sañ owners of the land involved be
awarded no damages as the said road and highway is a benefit to them and as they
have heretofore, in fact, dedicated the sa,e to public use; and that it is nec-
essary that the said higheay, as heretofore established, be legally dedicated to
the public, which is hereby done for all purposes and intent and that the said
county Engineer is authorized to stake the road, as provided for by law.

National Bank of Claremore, Oklahoma, be made an official depository bank of the County
of Tulsa, Oklahoma, when bond is filed and approved. Said motion being vote^d upon
