RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, pursuant to petition of affected property owners filed with the County Clerk November 7, 1951, and Publication Notice in the Tulsa Daily Legal News, as required by law, does hereby relinquish all right, title or interest the said County of Tulsa, Oklahoma, may have acquired by virtue of a certain Dedication of Street as contained in Plat of "JoHansen Acres" to Tulsa, Tulsa County, Oklahoma, being Plat No. 1650, filed of record in the office of the County Clerk of said County the 14th day of December, 1950, insofar as said dedication covers the following described real estate situated in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, to-wit:

A strip of ground thirty feet in width, be- 23rd Street, along the North boundary line of JoHansen Acres, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point 50 feet East of the N. W. corner of S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 14, Township 19 N., Range 13 E. Tulsa County, Oklahoma, thence E. along the N. boundary line of said tract a distance of 1242.27 feet to a point, thence S. a distance of 30 feet to a point, thence W. and parallel to the N. line a distance of 1242.28 feet to a point, thence N. a distance 30 feet to the point of beginning, and a strip of ground 30 feet in width being 23rd Street along and North boundary line of JoHansen Acres, as aforesaid; beginning at a point 40 feet W. of the N.E. corner of said Addition; thence W. a distance of 1252.28 feet to a point; thence N. a distance of 30 feet to the point of beginning, more or less, for the purpose of vacating this easement, which was to be known as 23rd Street,

which said tract of land has never been used, opened or accepted by the County of Tulsa for street or road purposes and is not needed or required by the County for said purpose, reserving, however, to the public, the North 5 feet thereof as a right-of-way easement for the installation, maintenance and operation of all public utilities and sanitary and storm sewers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to execute and acknowledge this relinquishment in order that it may be recorded in the Deed Records in the office of the County Clerk of said County.

The Board of Directors of Water Improvement District No. 20, and each member thereof, and their attorneys, Hunt and Eagleton, and their consulting Engineer, W. W. Wheeler, were present representing the District. Fred Q. Casler and his Attorney, Amos Nichols were present. The Petition of Protest filed by Fred Q. Casler with the County Clerk on December 15, 1951, was presented. After general discussion had with reference to plans, specifications, estimates of cost and protests thereto, it was moved by Caffey, seconded by Bailey and unanimously carried, the hearing on the plans, specifications and estimates of cost for the public distribution system of Water Improvement District No. 20 and protests
