MONDAY, JULY 6th, 1942.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, July 6th, 1942, at the hour of 10:00 o'clock A.M., with all members present: J. B. Gray, Ralsa F. Morley and Curtis Greer. Andy Stokes, County Clerk.

Motion by Commissioner Morley that J. B. Gray be re-appointed Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners for the year beginning July 1st, 1942 and ending July 1st, 1943. Motion seconded by Commissioner Greer, and upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.

J. B. Gray, Chairman presiding, the following business was transacted.

Motion by Commissioner Greer, seconded by Commissioner Morley that Joe. T. Parkinson, County Treasurer, be authorized to buy \$30,000 (Maturity) War Bonds out of the Sinking Fund. Upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.

This being the day set for the opening of bids on the furnishing of all necessary materials required for the improvement and paving of Apache Street from Peoria Avenue to Sheridan Road, a distance of 3.93 miles. The bids were as follows:

| Standard Paving Company | 136,467.73 |
| Amulco Products, Inc. | 140,774.38 |

Motion by Commissioner Morley, seconded by Commissioner Greer, that the bids be referred to the County Engineer and Consulting Engineer for compilation. Upon roll call, all members voting in the affirmative, motion was by the Chairman declared carried.
