BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County sitting in regular meeting, that the SOUTH LINE of the Peace District No. 3 of Tulsa County be moved from the south line of Township 20 North, south to a line coinciding with the center line of State Highway No. 33 in said County, and that the NORTH line of Justice of the Peace District No.5 be moved from the north line of Township 19 North, south to a line coinciding with the center line of State Highway No. 33 in said County.
