MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE APRIL 11, 2002

The Board of County Commissioners of Tulsa County met at 9:30 a.m., with the following members present: Robert N. Dick, Chairman; Wilbert E. Collins, Sr.; and John Selph. Member absent: none. Others present: Paul Wilkening, Wayne Carr, Tom Trimble, Jennifer Edwards, Mark Knowlton, Kirby Crowe, and Pam Hayes.

Chairman called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m., and the following business was transacted:

Trimble presented the Tulsa County Retirement Board's request for approval of Resolution increasing the current contribution rate from 7% to 8.5% for the Employees' Retirement System. The actuarial study showed this change was needed for sound operation of the retirement fund. Moved by Selph, seconded by Collins, to approve the recommendation of the Tulsa County Retirement Board to increase the County contribution rate from 7% to 8.5% for the Employee's Retirement System, effective July 1, 2002. Upon roll call: Selph, yes; Collins, yes; Dick, yes. Motion carried. (Clerk's Misc. File No. 184341)

Jennifer Edwards presented the April Staff Report for River Parks Authority. The Authority has approved the concept to create a "small critter" educational area in the park at 96th and Riverside, which will eventually include twenty-four donated life-size bronzes of small animals and birds. West Bank trail extension from 56th Street to Arkansas River will be advertised for construction bids shortly. BOK Plaza/Fountain work is progressing with the "Arkansas River Otters" sculpture being moved to a more visible location. Completion of the project is expected July 2002. The Authority will attend County budget hearings next week to request funds for FY 2002-2003. There are still two park directory signs available for purchase – one at Old West Playground and one at Turkey Mountain. Tulsa Salutes Freedom has received \$111,700 in sponsorship pledges and the public has been asked for input regarding patriotic songs to accompany the fireworks. Plans are progressing for the Great Tulsa Bike Ride (May 5), Tulsa Youth Council's Battle of the Bands (May 11), and Clear Channel Riverfest (June 7-8). The Authority is working with different user groups at Turkey Mountain to mark
