

February 16th, 1940.

Motion by Commissioner Sallee, seconded by Commissioner Shepard, that an additional \$1,000 be allocated to the Welfare Department for groceries for the month of February, 1940, and show that the figures that have been produced are that District No. 1 has a case load of 1669; District No. 2 has 1117 and District No. 3 has 320, and that the allocation for the entire month of February be apportioned accordingly. Upon roll call, the following vote was taken: Shepard, Aye; Sallee, Aye; Morley, No. Mr. Morley: No, because you penalize the district because the case-worker is so conservative that she will not put them on when they are in dire need - it awards the one that spends and penalizes the one that has been conservative. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner Sallee, seconded by Commissioner Morley, that \$50.00 of the \$1,000 allocation be allowed Mrs. Kirkpatrick for emergencies and that \$50.00 be taken out of the Shoe Account for the purchase of shoes for the month of February, 1940. Upon roll call, the following vote was taken: Shepard, Aye; Morley, Aye; Sallee, Aye. Motion carried.
