There appearing before the Board representatives of the Rose Hill Cemetry protesting the opening of such road way beginning at a point 100 feet east of the Southwest corner of the West One Half ( $W_2$ ) 66 the Southeast quarter ( $SE_2$ ) of Section Thirty Three (33), Township Twenty, (20), Range Thirteen (13) in Tulsa County, Oklahoma; thence south at a right angle for a distance of 668 Ft. to connect with what is known as the Ozark Trail, and setting forth such evidence, that in the opinion of the Board of County Commissioners a rehearing of said petition would be advisable, therefore, on motion of W. L. North, seconded by Ed Dalton it was resolved that said rehearing be on Monday, November 3rd, 1919, and that W. T. Davis be notified of such rehearing.

Dr Mont V. Stanley coming before the Board as requested, and on due consideration it was moved by Commissioner W. L. North and sedonded by Ed Dalton that Dr. Mont V. Stanley be appointed County Physician, and that dup notification we made of such appointment.

In the matter of the application of the bailiffs of the several different Courts for an increase in salary it was moved by W. L. North and seconded by Ed Dalton that in as much as the law does permit the payment of a salary in excess of the dalary they are now receiving, that such application must be disallowed.

A motion was made by W. L. North and seconded by Ed Dalton that the County Clerk advertise for bids for the remodering of the Tulsa County District Court Room in accordance with the plans and specifications now on file in the office of the County Clerk, and also for the construction of a partition in said court room and the placing of twelve jurors chairs and one judges bench, said bids to be received on Monday, November 3rd, 1919, at two o'clock P.M., in the Commissioners' office in the Tulsa County Court House.

In the matter of the application of the Sand Springs Home, a corporation, for the use of public highways of Tulsa County, Oklahoma, for the purposes of errecting and maintaining poles, wires and other apparatus and appliances within Tulsa County, Oklahoma, for the purpose of transmitting and selling to inhabitants and to other cities and towns in said County, electricity for light, heat and power; the following order was made.

" Now on this 6th day of October, 11919, the application of the Sand Springs, Home, acorporation, for theuse of certain public highways in TulsanCounty, Oklahoma, for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles, wires and other apparatus and appliances for the purpose of transmitting and selling to the inhabitants and to other towns and cities and towns in the said County, electricity for light, heat and power, coming on to be heard, this board finds that said petitioner, Sand Sp rings Home, is a corporation duly organized, and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Oklahoma, and is authorized by its charter to furnish electricity for heat, light and power to various inhabitants and municipalities with the County of Tulsa, and state of Oklahona; that said Sand Springs Home has made application to the towns of Sperry and Skiatook in said County, for a franchise to furnish said municipalities with electricity, and that it will be necessary to lay and maintain on the following public highways in said County, poles, wires and appratus and other appliances as may be proper to transmit said electricity to said municipalities, to Wit:-

Along the Section Line running east ans west between sections 26 and 35, and north and south between sections 25 and 26, and north and south between Sections 23 and 24 and east and west between sections 13 and 24, all in township 20 north, range 12 east, TulsaCounty, Oklahoma.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, that the Sand Springs Home be and is hereby authorized to use the above described public highways within TulsaCounty, and along such other section lines as petitioner may elect to use in said County for said purposes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, THAT THE installations of said poles, wires, etc., shall | be under the direction of the County Engineer and in such places and manner consistant with necessity to least interfere with other public highways and said highways shall not be unnecessarily obstructed and shall within a reasonable time be placed as near as practicable in as good condition and repair as before such construction, at the expense of the Samd Springs, Home; that in the event the Board of County Commissioner decide at any time to widen the said highways so used by the Sand Springs Home, that said sand springs home will move its poles lines to conforn to said highway at its own expense, and under the supervision of a county Engineer, and the said Sand Springs Home will hold the County harmless form any liability arising from any negligence, act or ommission.

In the matter of the application of the SandSptings Gas Company, to construct a three inch gas line, across the bridge over the Arkansas River in Section 14, Township 19 North Range 11 East, the following order was made: -

"Now on this 6th day of October, 1919, the petition of the Sand Springs Gas Company, A corporation, to lay a 3" gas line over and across the Arkansas River and use the floor of the County bridge in Sec. 14, Twp. 19 N., Range 11 E., coming on to be heard, and it apparing to this board that said corporation has a supply of natural gas lying west of the Arkansas River, and that it is nedessary to transport same to Sand Springs for domestic and industrial uses, and said being fully advised in the premises, it is ordered that the sand Springs GasCompany be, and it is hereby authorized to lay a 3" pipe line for transporting said natural gas across the County Bridgle or over the Arkansas River, and to use temporarily the floor of said bridge for said purpose, and will hold the County harmless in the event of accident of any character.
