

Party of the second part agrees to perform all the work between the hours of 5 o'clock P.M. and 7 O'clock A. M. on week days and to so perform and construct the work that the bridge will be open for traffic between the hours of 7 o'clock A. M. and five o'clock P. M. week days, and to handle and direct the work until the completion of the same subject to revision in the terms of this paragraph by the mutual consent of the parties hereto.

Party of the second part further agrees to save and keep harmless the party of the first part from any and all damage which may arise in the construction of the said floor.

All premium fees liability insurance to be considered as part of the labor cost and upon proper evidence of payment by the second party the same shall be reimbursed to the second party by the first party.

IN THE MATTER OF THE ROSE HILL CEMETRY ROAD.

WHEREAS, Heretofore, a resolution had been passed by the Board of County Commissioners on the 18th day of August, 1919, opening and locating a certain road beginning 100 feet East of the Southwest corner of the West one half (W $\frac{1}{2}$) of the Southeast quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of section Thirty three (33), township Twenty (20) Range Thirteen (13) East in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, thence south at a right angle for a distance of 668 feet to connect with what is known as the County Road, also known as the Ozark Trail; and the owners of the said land, traversed, namely, J. J. Hardin, appearing in person, and the petitioners appearing by R. E. Berger, attorney, whereby it was mutually agreed that a stipulation be entered into by the respective parties, namely, J. J. Harden, and the Board of County Commissioners ~~xxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxxx~~ whereby the said road was to be left open for public use until such time as the Board of County commissioners or their successors shall open the section line bounding the said J. J. Hardens land on the North and require the said J. J. Harden to remove his fence from the said section line.

That this agreement is understood to be in writing and to be signed by the respective parties.

R E S O L U T I O N .

WHEREAS, heretofore a petition having been filed, as provided for by law, praying ~~xxxx~~ the Honorable Board of County Commissioners to locate a road and establish the same beginning at a point mid-way on the East side of Section Four (4), Township Nineteen (19) North, Tange Thirteen (13) East, in Tulsa County, Oklahoma, thence west on the said line to the intersection with the county road running north and south between section four (4) and five (5) of said township and range.

It appearing that the said road and highway having been found necessary and that all the lands for the purposes and use for the said roads has been donated with the exception of a strip of land five (5) feet wide off the south side of Lot Eleven (11) Block Two, (2) Rodgers Heights Sub-division, to the City of Tulsa, which last described will ~~xxx~~ necessarily have to be condemned to make a uniform road and highway of fifty (50 Ft.) Feet.

Be it Therefore resolved, that the road and highway be uniform width of fifty (50) Feet of the half section line above described, and that the said five (5) feet be condemned, as provided for by law, the petitioners to pay all expense in connection herewith.
