A motion was made by W. L. North and seconded by F. M. Wooden that Monroe Neal be appointed Road Supervisor of ranges ten (10) and eleven (11) of Red Fork Township, and that said Monroe Neal be required to file a bond with the Board of County Commissioners in the amount of \$1,000.00. Said motion was then voted upon, all members voting in the affirmative.

Proposals were fyled by Joseph T. Lantry, Contractor, Tulsa, Oklahoma, and The Concrete Steel and Construction Company, of Joplin, Missouri. for the construction of the Owasso-Bird Creek Bridge, where Bird creek crosses Section "G" of the Tulsa County Highway. Both proposals were read by the Clerk to the Board and on motion of W. L. North, seconded by Ed Dalton, the low bidder, Joseph T. Lantry was awarded the constact for the construction of said bridge. Contract and bond to be filed, and a bond filed with this Board of County Commissioners for te the faithful performance of work under said contract. All work to begin within forty five (45) days for the date of the award of said contract, and that the Check of the Concrete Steel and Construction Company be returned.

A motion was made by F. M. Wooden and seconded by W. L. North that the Claims to Reduce the Constitution of the Constitution o of Ruby Greer, Margaret Heyerman, and Joe Gosinski covering services for Dr. C. L. Reeder in the Public Health Clinic be allowed and paid from the 1918-19 consolidated balance. Motion carried.

The following resolution was offered by Ed Dalton who moved its adoption:

"WHEREAS, it is necessary that all claims against Tulsa County be examined and audited before being presented to this Board,; Therefore, be it resolved that the County Clerk in connection with Ed O. Cassidy, special deputy state examiner and inspector, be and they are hereby directed to examine and audit all claims filed against Tulsa County before being presented to the Board of County Commissioners, and make such recommendation to the said Beard as is profitable, and that for the purpose of examining and auditing all claims, the County Clerk is hereby directed to present no claim to this Board which has not been upon the claim claendar for at least five (5) days prior to the meeting of the Board, provided however, this does not apply to claims for salaries, and be it further resolved t that at each meeting of this Board that a statement be filed showing the unexpended bakances of each appropriation." The motion was then seconded by W. WL. North, and a vote disclosed that all members present voted in the affirmative, and the motion was declared adopted as read and ordered spread upon the minutes of this meeting.

The account of James Woolley for boarding prisoners for the month of November Saarding taken on the report of the County 1919, was filed and approved, a like action being taken on the report of the County Clerk, Register of Deeds Department for the month of November, also the Financial Beatement of the Engineering Department.

There being no further business before the Board at this meeting, on motion the Board adjourned to meet Tuesday December 2nd, 1919.
