(Skiatook-Collinsville Road.)

A motion was made by by W. L. North and seconded by Ed Dalton that the Section Line between Sections three: (3) and Four (4) township Nineteen (19) north, Range Thirteen (13) East, be and the same is hereby ofdered opened for public travle, W. N. Hudson, by these same presents agreeing to five a detour road where the said section line crosses the Rail Road. All members voting in the affirmative.

The report of Edd O. Cassidy, Special Deputy State Examiner and Inspector, on the condition of the regular audit, and also relative to special worn in connection with the audit of the records of Tulsa County, was presented to the Board, and upon motion of W. L. North, seconded by Ed Dalton the report was adopted and the State Examiner and Inspector instructed to perform the services as outlined in the report. Said report being as follows, to wit:-

"HON. BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, TULSA, TULSA COUNTY, OKLAHOMA.

Gentlemen: -

Pursuant to a conference held on the 19th day of February, 1920, between Hon. Fred Parkinson, State Examiner and Inspector, Hon. F. m. Wooden, Chairman of the Board of County Commissioners, and the undersigned, I am herewith advising you in regard to the regular aidut of the county of Tulsa, and likewise the special work from time to time by your Board assigned to the audit and which is uncompleted.

The regular audit has been completed with the exception of a few days work on the Sheriff's officer for 1917, Wm. McCullough, Sheriff, and the audit on the same office for the year 1918. The audit on the sheriffs office for the year 1918 has not yet been begun for the reason that before such work could be instituted, is was necessary to complete a detailed audit of the County, Superior and District Courts in order to establish a control of the sheriff's office fot that year on the detailed amounts paid by the Court Clerk to the sheriff for the several courts and we have just recently completed the detailed audit of the several courts for that year.

With the exception of the sheriff's office rhe work of the regular audit is completed up to and including December 31st, 1918, and the officer of the County Clerk, Register of Deeds division has been completed up to and including December 31st, 1919.

Under instructions received from Mr. Parkinson, State Examiner and Inspector, I have transmitted to the department at Oklahoma City, all of the complete audit for the purpose of having same typewritten as the expense of reducing the report to typewritten form will be less by having it done in Oklahoma City, and said work is now in progress and will be rushed to completion in order that the same may be presented for your consideration at as eatly date as possible. The volumn of this work is much more than you have probably conceived as the detailed report already transmitted weighs in the neighborhood of 100 pounds.

During the past six months from time to time your Boars has requested the following special services to be preformed by the representatives of the Department assigned here, to wit:-

- 1. Special Examination and Audit of the Tax Ferrit's Rolls for the year 1917 and 1918, M. C. Williams, tax ferrit,
- 2. Special Examination and addit of the drainage districts within the County for the purpose of ascertaining the amount of assessments against the non-taxable lands with such districts, and certifying such amount to the Congressman representing
