The report of the County Attorney's Office In Re: Acme Farm, property of Glenn R. Kimball was the first matter before the meeting, which report was as follows:

GLENN R.

KIMBALL

"Hon. Board of County Commissioners, Tulsa County, Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Gentlemen:-

We were directed by you to investigate and make report at your March meeting, on the petition filed by citizens living east of the City of Tulsa who had purchased property from Glenn R. Kimball, which said property had not been by him properly platted into lots and blocks are by law required.

We desire to report to you that we have made diligent and earnest effort to persuade Mr. Kimball to comply with the laws and have this land properly platted. We have been unsuccessful in our efforts along that line.

You are advised further that under the law where the property is sold in lots and not proper plat has been filed as required that it is your privilefe and duty to have such plat made and recorded and that the land lord shall pay a forfeit of \$10.00 for each and every lot disposed of by him. We iunderstand that twenty two lots have been disposed of. There is also and additional penalty for delay and we recommend that you direct us to file suit against Glenn R. Kimball to collect these forfeitures; and we further recommend that you have the county Engineer proceed in the making and filing of the proper plat, and in this connection you are advised that we will be glad to co-operate with the County Engineer to the end that this property may be legally platted.

For your convenience we have prepared and are enclosing a minute to be incorporated in your record.
