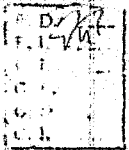

OFFICIAL FORM

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Henry M. Price  
and Victoria G. Price his wife, for and in consideration  
of the sum of Sixteen Hundred DOLLARS,  
I have paid by Mary E. Green receipt of which is hereby acknowledged and confessed

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Mary E. Green  
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Beginning at the South West Corner of Lot 6, thence running North One Hundred and Twelve and Five Hundredths (112.05) feet  
thence in a northeasterly direction Eighty-Two (82) feet, thence in a South Easterly direction One Hundred and Twelve and  
Five Hundredths (112.05) feet, thence in a Southwesterly direction One Hundred and Six feet and Eight (8) inches (106 8/12)  
to the place of beginning all in Block 203, Tulsa, I.T.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Mary E. Green  
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.  
And hereby covenant with said Mary E. Green that we will forever  
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Victoria G. Price wife of the said Henry M. Price for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Mary E. Green  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
