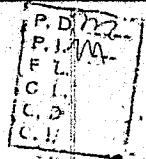

OFFICIAL FORM

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Bird Slaughter (married as Bird White water)
and W. S. Slaughter, her husband his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Four Hundred DOLLARS,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said The Cherokee Company
and unto its heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Cherokee Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

North one half of Southwest quarter of North west quarter and South East quarter of South
west quarter of Northwest quarter of Northwest quarter of Section nine (9) Township
Twenty-one (21) North Range Fourteen (14) East containing forty acres more
or less.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said The Cherokee Company
and unto its heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said The Cherokee Company that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, W. S. Slaughter, husband wife of the said Bird Slaughter (married as Bird White water) for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said

The Cherokee Company all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
