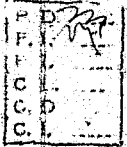

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, W. H. Brown
and Alice E. Brown his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of One DOLLARS,
in hand paid by George West, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said George West
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the _____ Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Six, Seven, Eight and Nine (6-7-8-9), Blk. Four (4) Surveys Addition to Tulsa.
This deed is given in lieu of a former deed between parties hereto, which
has been lost or misplaced

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said George West
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
And hereby covenant with said George West that we will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Alice E. Brown wife of the said W. H. Brown for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
George West all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
