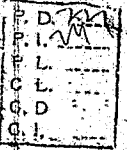

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, A. K. Williams
and Bessie L. Williams his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Twelve and 50/100 DOLLARS,
to us paid by C. O. Hood

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said C. O. Hood
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the NE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 and Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: the West half (shown on the U.S. Survey, as lots
1 & 2) of the NW 1/4 of Sec. 31, T. 19 N and Range 14 E. Creek Nation Western District
of the Indian Territory, to-wit:
Lot 15 No Fifteen Block 29 No. Twenty nine in Valley, I. T.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said C. O. Hood
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
And ^{we} hereby covenant with said C. O. Hood that we will forever
warrant and defend the title ^{to the} of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Bessie L. Williams wife of the said A. K. Williams for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
C. O. Hood all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
