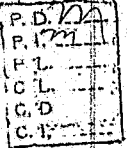

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, George Bullette
and Bettie Bullette his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Five Hundred no. 00 DOLLARS,
The receipt of the same being hereby acknowledged and to us in hand
paid by John D. Coats

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said John D. Coats
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Cherokee Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

A tract of land, the same being the Northwest Quarter of the North East Quarter,
of the Northwest Quarter of Section Thirty (30) Township Twenty (20) North, Range
Thirteen (13) East

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said John D. Coats
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John D. Coats that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Bettie Bullette wife of the said George Bullette for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said

John D. Coats all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
