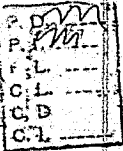

## WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Frank Chesley  
and Nellie A. Chesley his wife, for and in consideration  
of the sum of One Thousand DOLLARS,  
In hand paid by C. W. Singleton receipt of which is hereby acknowledged  
and confessed

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said C. W. Singleton  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of lot Six (6) in Block Three (3) in the Lindsey addition to the  
City of Tulsa, Indian Territory, according to the recorded plat thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said C. W. Singleton  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said C. W. Singleton that we will forever  
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever. Except a mortgage of \$400.00  
in favor of Frank Chesley

And I, Nellie A. Chesley wife of the said Frank Chesley for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said  
C. W. Singleton all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
