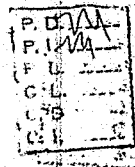

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Lon R. Stansbery and Myrtle C. Stansbery, (wife)
and John N. Day and Katherine M. Day his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Four hundred and twenty five (\$425.) DOLLARS,
Cash in hand paid

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said C. O. Wallitt
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Stansbery Addition to Tulsa Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

All of Lot Number Eleven (11) in Block Five (5) in the Stansbery Addition to Tulsa
Indian Territory, according to recorded plat thereof

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said C. O. Wallitt
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said C. O. Wallitt that _____ will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

C. O. Wallitt and Katherine M. Day, wife of John N. Day
And I, Myrtle C. Stansbery wife of the said Lon R. Stansbery for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said

C. O. Wallitt all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
