WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, George F. Blevins
and Maudie Blevins his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500.00) DOLLARS,
in hand paid by John H. Hill and Etta L. Hill the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said John H. Hill and Etta L. Hill
and unto their heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Town of Tulsa Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

all that part of lot three (3) in Block forty six (46), which lies north and
east of the right of way of the Missouri, Kansas and Texas railway.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said John H. Hill and Etta L. Hill
and unto their heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said John H. Hill and Etta L. Hill that we will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Maudie Blevins wife of the said George F. Blevins for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said John H. Hill
& Etta L. Hill all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
