of the sum of Fifteen Hundred DOLLARS,  
to us paid by L. G. Jahn

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said L. G. Jahn  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Julia Recording Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  and the S.W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section Thirty six  
(36) Township Nineteen (19) North, Range Fourteen (14) East of  
the Indian Meridian

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said L. G. Jahn  
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.  
And <sup>we</sup> hereby covenant <sup>with</sup> said L. G. Jahn that they will forever  
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all <sup>lawful</sup> claims whatever against them

And I, Elizabeth A. Wilson wife of the said E. G. Wilson for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said  
L. G. Jahn all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
