Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Lou R. Stansbery and Myrtle C. Stansbery
and John N. Day and Katherine M. Day his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Six Hundred DOLLARS,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said L. W. Eichelberger
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot 11 one in Block (5) five. In the Stansbery Addition to Tulsa, I. T.
according to the recorded plat thereof.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said L. W. Eichelberger
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereto belonging.
And hereby covenant with said L. W. Eichelberger that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Myrtle C. Stansbery wife of the said Lou R. Stansbery,
And I, Katherine M. Day wife of the said John N. Day for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
L. W. Eichelberger all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
