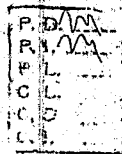

## WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, I, Harrison Curry, a single man  
and his wife, for and in consideration  
of the sum of Five Hundred and 20/100 DOLLARS,  
to me paid by Ella Byrd

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Ella Byrd  
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Residing, Western  
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

The East Half (E 1/2) Lot Two (2) Block Eighty (80) in the  
original townsite of the Town of Tulsa, Creek Nation

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Ella Byrd  
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.  
And hereby covenant with <sup>the</sup> said Ella Byrd that I will forever  
warrant and defend the title <sup>to</sup> said lands against all <sup>lawful</sup> claims whatever.

And I, wife of the said for and  
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said  
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands  
WITNESS <sup>my</sup> ~~our~~ hands and seals, on this 14th day of June 1906
