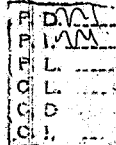

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Lilah D. Lindsey
and L. W. Lindsey, her husband his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Two Hundred & Fifty no/100 DOLLARS,
the receipt of the same being hereby acknowledged and to us paid by Mrs Bird B. Carle

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Mrs Bird B. Carle
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the City of Tulsa Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lot Ten (10) Block Eight (8) Lindsey First addition to City of Tulsa, Ind Ter
as per plat filed of the same

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Mrs Bird B. Carle
and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Mrs Bird B. Carle that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, L. W. Lindsey, husband wife of the said Lilah D. Lindsey for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
Mrs Bird B. Carle all my rights of ^{country} dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
