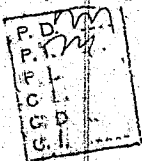

OFFICIAL FORM

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, J. W. Smith
and Libbie Smith his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Five hundred DOLLARS,
In hand paid by W. O. Dickenson, receipt of the same being hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said W. O. Dickenson
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Cherokee Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: An undivided one-half interest in and to the north
one half of the north west quarter of the south east quarter, and the south one half of
the south west quarter of the north east quarter, and the northeast quarter of the north east
quarter of the south west quarter, all in Section seven (7) Township Twenty two (22) North,
Range thirteen (13) East, containing Fifty acres more or less.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said W. O. Dickenson
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
And hereby covenant with said W. O. Dickenson that they will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Libbie Smith wife of the said J. W. Smith for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
W. O. Dickenson all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
