do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Lydia C. Chesley
 and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western
 District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots four (4) Five (5) and Six (6) in Block One (1) in Lindsay first addition to City
of Tulsa, Ind Ter. according to plat made by J. Gus Patton and now on record

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Lydia C. Chesley
 and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Lydia C. Chesley that they will forever
 warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Joseph C. Mitchell, husband wife of the said Laura B. Mitchell for and
 in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
Lydia C. Chesley all my rights of ^{courtesy} ~~dower~~ and homestead in and to the said lands.
