WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, William P. Gilcrease and Lyzie Gilcrease his wife, and James M. Arthur and Ida B. Arthur his wife, for and in consideration of the sum of \$125.00 One hundred twenty-five and no/100 DOLLARS, to us in hand paid by R. O. Weathers of Muskogee, Ind. Ter., do receipt of which is hereby acknowledged,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said R. O. Weathers and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: and in the town of Weahaka To-wit: all of Lot number seven (7) in Block number Twenty-five (25) according to the official Plat of said Town on file in the 28th Recording District at Tulsa, Ind. Ter.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said R. O. Weathers and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant & with said R. O. Weathers that we will forever warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Lyzie Gilcrease wife of the said William P. Gilcrease, wife of the said James M. Arthur for and in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said R. O. Weathers all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
