



WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Oscar K. Eysenbach
and Bessie C. Eysenbach his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of One Thousand DOLLARS,
in hand paid

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Robert E. Lynch
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Green Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit:

Lots (5) five and (6) six and the West five acres of the S.E. 1/4 or (16) ten acres of Lot (2) seven
and the South West 10.96 acres of lot (2) seven all of Section (2) seven township (19) Nineteen North and Range
twelve East.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Robert E. Lynch
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenants with said Robert E. Lynch that he will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, Bessie C. Eysenbach wife of the said Oscar K. Eysenbach for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said

Robert E. Lynch all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
