WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.

Know all Men by these Presents, That we, Edward McCoy and Harriet P. McCoy his wife
and J. L. Cook and W. A. Cook her husband his wife, for and in consideration
of the sum of Twelve Hundred Thirty Three and 3/4 DOLLARS,

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Stephen H. Covey
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western
District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: The North half of lot 6, Block 15, Tulsa, Indian Territory, more fully
described as follows: Commencing at the NW corner of said lot running in an easterly direction along the north line
of said lot 140 feet to alley; thence southerly fifty (50) feet; thence easterly parallel with the north line of said
lot One Hundred and forty feet (140); thence northerly fifty feet (50) to place of beginning

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Stephen H. Covey
and unto his heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.

And hereby covenant with said Stephen H. Covey that we will forever
warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever. And J. L. Cook, husband of J. L. Cook for and in
consideration of the said sum of money do hereby release and relinquish unto the said Stephen H. Covey all my right of country and homestead in said lands.

And I, Harriet P. McCoy wife of the said Edward McCoy for and
in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
Stephen H. Covey all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
