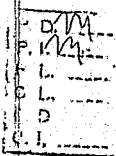

WARRANTY DEED—WITH RELINQUISHMENT OF DOWER.



Know all Men by these Presents, That we, J. S. Kemble
 and a single man his wife, for and in consideration
 of the sum of Fifty hundred DOLLARS,
 to me in hand paid by Rosa Kemble the receipt thereof being hereby acknowledged

do hereby grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said Rosa Kemble
 and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, the following lands lying in the Creek Nation Western
 District of the Indian Territory, to-wit: All my interest in and to the following described lands, Beginning
at the North West corner of Lot five (5) in Section six (6) Township nineteen (19) North, Range Thirties (13)
East, thence East on a line between the Creek and Cherokee Nations four hundred fifty (450) feet, thence South
Three hundred feet (300) thence West four hundred fifty (450) feet, thence North Three hundred (300) feet to place of beginning
containing 3.09 acres more or less as the case may be according to the survey thereof.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD THE SAME unto the said Rosa Kemble
 and unto her heirs and assigns, forever, with all appurtenances thereunto belonging.
 And hereby covenant with said Rosa Kemble that I will forever
 warrant and defend the title of said lands against all claims whatever.

And I, wife of the said for and
 in consideration of the said sum of money, do hereby release and relinquish unto the said
all my rights of dower and homestead in and to the said lands.
